Georgian Triangle Youth Ministry

The GTYM is a partnership of churches and ministries serving our region's high school students. This partnership currently includes Hope Chapel, Journey Community Church, Christian Reform Church, Clearview Community Church, New Life Church, and Youth Unlimited/YFC. We have also had the support of others such as Walmart, Living Water Resort, and a number of community members.

Food goes fast around here. Every Wednesday, we serve over 300 young people lunch, which equates to over 400 hotdogs. The other weekdays we host more than 200 students each day who come for the tasty baked goods and beverages...we go through approximately seventeen dozen cookies each day and countless drinks such as water, coffee, tea, iced tea, hot chocolate when it's chilly outside and iced coffee in the warmer months. Students can come for the works or just to hangout.

The opportunities that arise from this connection have proven to be priceless.

Overall, students have really connected with what began as a simple gesture of being provided a cookie and a drink, and in turn have begun giving back.






Welcome Officer Christine

Amongst our current partnerships, Hope Chapel is providing Youth Unlimited/YFC office space in our facility. This has allowed our two ministries to further partner in the meeting of needs within our community. Our Community Cupboard provides donated clothing to those in need through Youth Unlimited/YFC's "Clothing Room" and Hope Chapel is able to provide fresh/frozen and shelf stable food items, as well as toiletries and cleaning supplies to individuals on a supplementary basis, free of charge.

You may have also noticed our "Giving Tree" located outside Hope Chapel at our side entrance which is kept stocked with seasonal items for community members who may have difficulty sourcing these items for various reasons. We are grateful this winter for the many donated hats, gloves and scarves that are blessing our community.
